We're delighted that you are visiting our campus. RMCAD's campus is rich with history and we have big plans for the future!

In 1963, Philip J. Steele founded Rocky Mountain College of Art + Design in the foothills of Colorado. Since then, the college has grown at an incredible pace with expansions to the physical campus, faculty and programs.

The campus you're visiting today has a unique past. More than 100 years ago, the Jewish Consumptive Relief Society (JCRC) founded a haven for patients suffering from tuberculosis. Spanning 148 acres and occupying 34 buildings, the self-sustaining campus had a post office, meteorological station and working dairy farm. By the early 1950's, tuberculosis had been largely eradicated and the JCRC was repurposed to perform cancer treatment. In 1954, the institution changed its name to the American Medical Center (AMC). In 1985, the mission of AMC adapted to focus on cancer research, rather than treatment.

In 2002 RMCAD purchased the buildings and 24 surrounding acres that make up today's campus. We're proud to be listed on the National Register of Historic Districts and work hard to honor our past while offering access to cutting edge technology and instruction.
